### Outreach Program

Our new Outreach Program began in late 2020. With various different supports for people living within the low-income threshold our Outreach Coordinator has been busy working with community members. The supports offered include:

#### Pandemic Recovery

- assistance in paying arrears due to the COVID19 Pandemic

### **Employment Support**

- A program to support people who have secured employment but need a little additional support. Personal Protection Equipment • Criminal Records Check

#### **Financial Support**

We know that it is often a series of crises that lead people into chronic poverty or homelessness. This program considers one-time emergency support payments, provided directly to the vendor.

#### **ID** Supports

Identification is a requirement for many services and we recognize the difficulties in acquiring or replacing ID cards. While our capacity in this particular area is limited, we can provide support in acquiring, renewing or replacing MSI cards, NS ID cards or changing gender markers. Support to acquire other forms of ID will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

#### **One-to-One Advocacy**

It can be challenging to defend your rights or ensure your needs are being met. Sometimes it can be helpful to add the support of another voice. Our Outreach Coordinator is nonjudgmental, client-directed, and solution-focused which means they will listen to your story, clarify the outcome(s) you want/need, share information on possible ways to get there and advocate on your behalf.

- A program to help people overcome barriers and reenter the workforce. Offering a range of interventions to eligible clients including:
- supportive counselling
- referrals to community employment-readiness programs
- covering costs of employment-related
- transportation, childcare and supplies
- assistance with training related costs

We hope to be able to open our doors to guests again soon and with that in mind, we are undertaking a program participant survey to look at what services we are offering and what might be needed. This will be especially important when we open our doors and launch our Drop-In Program.

We will be looking at dietary options for the food bank and special monthly programming such as tax filing, single parent support and more for the Drop-In Program.

This survey will inform us about what the community needs from us. From the answers we receive we will be able to look at our resources and see how we can continue to adapt our programs to support those struggling with poverty.
