AT THE CROSSROADS

Brunswick Street Mission sits at the cross-roads of two crises facing our community: the rising cost of living and a severe housing shortage. Both are pushing more and more of our neighbours to our doors.

Our **Outreach Program** aims to catch those who fall between the cracks. This can mean providing mental health supports and practices, or working with partner agencies to find permanent secure housing. These can be critical interventions for someone who unexpectedly becomes homeless. Someone like Dean.

Dean recently started coming to our Breakfast Program after he became homeless. Our social worker, Patrick, connected with Dean, providing some basic needs, like laundry facilities, medication, and food. You can watch Dean's story at brunswickstreetmission.org/dean.

Our **Food Bank** and **Breakfast Program** support a variety of people who do not have food security, including some who are working or in school. An increasing number of housed folks are using our Food Bank. One third of food bank users are unhoused.
