Covid Impacts

- Late AGM last year due to limitations around holding AGMs as video conference
- Subsequent bylaw change and update. This is the second year we will be holding the AGM online which has increased turnout due to accessibility
- Significant effort spent creating and implementing Covid 19 protocols in preparation for possible opening
- No access to Porter Creek until April 2021
- Full year without Youth Team or Public Drop In
- Impacts to membership numbers as no incentive for reduced rate Drop In and community events
- Wall improvements to Porter Creek with funding from YG initiatives

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, high school aged youth were restricted to their school bubbles. As the Youth team welcomes youth from high schools across Whitehorse, we were unable to operate this program this year.

As the pandemic progressed and access was modified, youth were invited to train and climb on Mondays while adhering to Climb Yukon's approved Covid plan.

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic which resulted in limited access to our climbing facility, Climb Yukon was unable to operate any of the programs it might normally have been able to offer throughout the year.





Territorial Sport Organization (TSO)

Climbing Escalade Canada (CEC) is the national governing body of the sport of competition climbing in Canada. The purpose of the CEC is to be a leader in the promotion and development of competition climbing in Canada. As the newest member of the CEC, Climb Yukon is the official governing body for sport climbing in the Yukon, opening the door to a diversity of funding streams. Climb Yukon has been working with the Community Services branch to explore this new status and will be an important voice for athletes from the Yukon Territory and help them achieve their highest potential.

Climb Yukon's designation as the official Territorial Sport Organization is another step towards building the sport of climbing locally in the Yukon. We look forward to working with the CEC and YG to continue our mission to promote youth climbing both recreationally and competitively.

Funding

Under YG's, A Path Forward, local Sport and Recreation Organizations were required to adjust how they operate and run programming.

The Federal Government created a temporary relief fund to help support Culture, Heritage and Sport Organizations to continue to operate through COVID 19. The \$72 million identified for Sport Organizations was divided amongst NSO's and P/TSOs to distribute to their local sport and recreation organizations.

Climb Yukon Association received a total of \$5,647. Funding was used to pay for expenses typically covered by income earned from events, drop-in fees from Porter Creek and memberships.

The result is that we have a safe clean space for the youth to climb when available, we have liquid chalk available for use, and a beautiful newly painted climbing wall that we can limit the use to supervised hours.



Funding

Lotteries Projects Fund- Opportunity Projects Equipment: Functional training, climbing shoes and gear


\$3,000 was provided to Climb Yukon for the purchase of training and climbing equipment

Lotteries Projects Fund- Regular Intake Equipment: Bouldering Flooring

\$21,090 was provided to Climb Yukon for a seamless modular flooring system by Canadian climbing company *Flashed*. The flooring provides a safe landing zone for climbers.

Northern Youth Abroad (NYA)

Climb Yukon received a \$500 microgrant from NYA in support of northern-based activities, projects, and ideas that engage youth. The funding will be used to expand the selection of dimension volumes

Climbing Facility Project

In October 2019, YG released the Whitehorse Gymnastics and Climbing Feasibility report.

Summary of findings:

- The report concluded that a Climbing gym could be successful within Whitehorse
- A Consolidated Facility between Climb Yukon and Polarettes makes the most economic sense
- The financial impact is proportional for gymnastics and Climbing with respect to initial expenditure and the return on investment is similar between the groups
- Operational efficiencies could be realized between the clubs by sharing support and program space
- A location is needed to be identified

Where we are today:

- Climb Yukon has been working with YG on architectural designs for the building
- A location has been identified as meeting the requirements of the build
- Recognition of increased costs due to economic impacts of Covid, material and labor shortages
- The Liberal Party, Yukon Party and NDP all committed to moving forward with the joint climbing and gymnastics facility pending federal budget approval
- Project is at the Federal funding application stage
