



DAY CAMP COVID-19 INFORMATION CONSENT FORM

Drop-off and pick-up

We encourage 1 member of the family to be responsible for drop off and pick up if possible. Drop off and Pick up will be done outside at the Stewart Hall entrance. Staff will meet families there in the morning starting at 7:45 am. Parents/ Guardians and the child(ren) attending camp will be required to complete health screening before being permitted entrance into the camp each day.

Beginning at 3:55pm camp staff will meet parents/ guardians at the same door to being the pick up process. Should you need to pick your child up before then we will require that you call us at (902) 464-5106 and arrangements can be made.

Health screening

Children exhibiting any signs or symptoms of illness will not be permitted into the camp. Parents/ guardians will be responsible for completing a health screening form each day indicating that:

- The child(ren) is not experiencing any symptoms such as fever, cough, runny nose, headache, sore throat, fatigue, purple fingers or toes, diarrhea or loss of taste or smell
- The child(ren) and all associated family members have not travelled within the past 14 days where self-isolation is required.
- That the child(ren) and associated family members have not tested positive for Covid-19 within the past 14 days
- That the child(ren) have not been in contact within the past 14 days with someone who is being investigated or confirmed to be a case of Covid-19.

If the answer to any of the questions is positive the child(ren) will not be permitted access to camp that day.

There will also be a temperature check done of the child(ren) attending camp using a non-contact thermometer and should the temperature read over 37.8 Degrees Celsius the child(ren) will not be permitted access into the camp.

Temperature checks will also be done at 1pm again and should the temperature read over 37.8 Degrees Celsius they will be isolated away from the other children and parents/guardians contacted to come and pick them up within 1 hour.

Physical Distancing

The groups of 10 will include 8 children and 2 staff members. These group members will remain constant throughout the week. These groups of 10 will be exempt from physical distancing.

If additional staff from the original 2 are required to enter the room they will be wearing masks and physical distancing will be enforced with them.

The different groups of 10 will not interact with each other, physical distancing will be maintained between groups at all times.

Cleaning

Increased cleaning and disinfecting of high touch surfaces will be conducted throughout the day. All cleaning products used meet Health Canada's requirements for emerging viral pathogens.

Camps will have access to washrooms that are not utilized by others in the building, and the cleaning schedule of these bathrooms is done on an increased schedule.

Personal Hygiene

Handwashing with water and soap will occur a few times throughout the day for staff and children. Staff will educate the children on proper procedures and oversee that it is being done correctly. Hand washing will occur:

- on arrival;
- before and after meals;
- after using the toilet;
- after blowing nose, coughing or sneezing;
- after playing with shared toys;
- when taking medications; and
- after playing outside.

There is also access to hand sanitizer, but hand washing is the preferred method.

- Everyone is encouraged to cough or sneeze into their arm if required.
- Each child is required to have their own required grooming materials.
- Everyone is encouraged to avoid touching their face, nose and mouth.
- Staff will be wearing masks, and children are encouraged to bring and wear their own masks as well if they are comfortable doing so. However, masks are not required for the children.

Outbreak Management Plan

In the event that a case of COVID-19 is confirmed to be connected to a day camp setting, Public Health will provide additional guidance including ensuring that appropriate supports are in place to coordinate the response. One confirmed case of COVID-19 in a day camp setting would be considered an outbreak. Public Health actions and directions may include, but are not limited to:

- Contact tracing, which involves identifying contacts of a positive case and contacting those individuals Requesting records that identify cohorts/groups of staff and children in the day camp setting for a specified time frame
- Testing of staff and children that may have been exposed to a positive case
- Enhancing environmental cleaning
- Assessing need for facility closure

This may mean cancellation of camps, and in this case full refunds will be given if this does occur. If staff or children within the camp show symptoms they will immediately be isolated from the others and arrangements made for them to go home right away and contact Public Health and follow their recommendations. If this is the case we ask that parents/guardians make arrangements to come and collect their child(ren) within a 1 hour timeframe.
