An update from Heather Francis, Director of Health Services and Dr. Todd Howlett, Chief of Staff/Site Medical Lead.

On December 10, the hospital's new front entrance opens. This marks the official halfway point of Dartmouth's redevelopment and the first newly created space we will be moving into. This new space will give our hospital an open, modern, welcoming public space for patients and community. To make patients and public aware of this upcoming change, advertisements will run in The Chronicle Herald and The Star/ Metro newspapers, on Facebook and on the radio beginning in early December. In addition to paid media, all auto-generated patient letters now have a notice announcing the change in front entrance.

Also on December 10, we enter into the second phase of public space construction and renovations. This phase closes the original entrance, renovates the former registration area and improves office space. As a result of this work, there are a few changes that will impact patients and staff/physicians. For roughly four months, the cardiology and pacemaker clinics of internal medicine will only be accessible through the external stairway door adjacent the new front entrance. We know that this is not ideal for patients or staff during the winter months and we appreciate your accommodation and flexibility during this time.

Also during this time, the door to the main floor stairwell will be inaccessible. The stairwell will be open for travel between floors, but for access to the main floor from the basement or second floors the elevator must be used. We apologize for this inconvenience.

Recap of ongoing work:

- Work on the generator building across Pleasant Street continues.
- Mechanical, electrical and steel stud installation is underway in the new addition.
- Renovations to the 5th floor inpatient unit continue.
- The new addition exterior is now in place.
- Work on the parking lot is well underway with a retaining wall in place and underground waterworks installation in progress.
- In the back of the hospital, work is happening in the small parking lot adjacent the new addition and loading dock area.
- Lateral bracing (reinforcing the hospital structure) in the morgue area also continues.
