Wanda Graham Artistic Director, Playwright, Director

The Heart of Things is inspired by a true story. When a young fisher ropes himself to his mast in the harbour within sight of the local Legislature, he hopes to bring attention for change. Out of the tragedy that ensues emerges triumph. His twin decides to do things the way "we've always done them," only different. My advisors in creation have been the fishers I have known and loved in my own tiny fishing village of over 45 years. When one of my neighbors heard about my focus on young fisher stress and suicide he exclaimed, "Good! It's a f#*%ing epidemic and there's no help."

The playwright gratefully acknowledges the writing and development support for The Heart of Things from the Canada Council for the Arts, Arts Nova Scotia, Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre Retreat and dramaturg Maureen Labonté. John Plant exclaimed after receiving the text, "I immediately started composing!" John's music for The Heart of Things is the heart of things, an epic score for actors by a master of his craft.

Arts Nova Scotia and Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre supported Heat's first customized workshop to bring together for the first time the text and John's full sumptuous virtual score with six actors. Memory Lane Heritage Village opened its doors to Heat in partnership for this production. Thank you to the many skilled, talented actors who have gotten behind this project, couldn't do it without you.

I hope you, the audience, wonder at the extraordinary cast, for their grasp of and commitment to the epic scope of the drama and their musical mastery of something not everyone can do in a score that is to be spoken. Deepest thanks to that major-domo Gordon Hammond and what his myriad resources brought together to make dreams real. My everlasting thanks to the board of Heat Theatre for their passionate love for, and belief in, the power of theatre to change hearts and minds, one play at a time.

Wanda Graham is a playwright, actor, producer and director. During her tenure as Artistic Director of Stage East Theatre in Halifax she produced 13 shows, including nine new plays, four musicals - nine of them touring shows, many of which she directed and/or wrote.



She has toured many times througout Atlantic Canada as a freelance artist and with Stage East, Mulgrave Road Theatre, Neptune Theatre and Theatre New Brunswick. She has appeared with Black Theatre Workshops Montreal, multiple shows and workshops series with the National Arts Center, Ottawa, and once played the Toronto Fringe. For her acting work she was awarded the Jean A Chalmer's Award at the Stratford Festival and a Stagedoor Johnnie "Best Actress" for her work at the Blyth Festival.

Playwright residencies include the first Stratford Festival Playwrights Unit, Women's International Playwrights Conference Stockholm, multiple invitations to Banff Playwrights Unit, Playwrights Workshop Montreal and Playwrights Atlantic Retreat, residencies include Tableau d'hôte Montreal, Women's Work Festival St. John's, Factory Theatre Toronto's first National New Play Festival, Neptune Theatre (Brat), and Mulgrave Road Theatre (Kill Zone a love story). She was invited to speak at the Danish National Theatre School Copenhagen and at Boston's Popular Culture Conference.

Wanda was the Atlantic Rep for Playwrights Union Canada for many years and is founder and Honourary Lifetime Member of Playwrights' Atlantic Resource Centre. She was presented with Nova Scotia's first Established Artist Recognition Award Theatre.

John Plant Composer and Musical Director

When Wanda Graham sent me the gripping and vital text of 'The Heart of Things' it was clear that this text called for a new approach to music theatre. Operatic in scope and intensity, her words also manifested a rhythmic vitality and urgency, a surging momentum. It was an irresistible challenge, to create a soundscape which would sustain and project the world she had so vividly evoked. To do this, I notated the actors' lines rhythmically, and constructed the soundscape around them. Wanda's matchless ear for fishers' vernacular, and her structural sense of the dramatic arc - both of each scene and for the work as a whole - made this task a joyful adventure.

Most of the music was composed at the height of the pandemic, which somehow made it easier to work at white heat and with minimal distraction - I composed as if I had a huge orchestra at my disposal, preparing a full score (up to 30 staves) together with electronics and natural sounds. But the heart of my inspiration is Wanda's moving text, and the compelling vision which underlies it. I hope to have created a musical structure which projects that vision with the power and eloquence it deserves.

I am deeply grateful to Arts Nova Scotia for its support, and very excited to see it reach the stage.

He was the founding director of the Bruyere Culture Art and Healing Gallery, and he has published several creative nonfiction stories. Dr. Pottie's
