The Hon. Myra A. Freeman is the former Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia (2000-2006), a member of the Order of Canada, a recipient of the Meritorious Service Medal and the Order of Nova Scotia and the first Chancellor of the Order of Nova Scotia. A graduate of Dalhousie University, and former teacher with the Halifax Regional School Board, she is the recipient of six Honorary Doctorate Degrees, the Woman of Action Humanitarian Award from the Canadian Israel Research Foundation, and was recognized as a Trailblazer

and one of Canada's 100 Outstanding Women by the Richard Ivy School of Business and the Women's Executive Network. Appointed by the Government of Canada in 2003 and reappointed in 2010, she continues to serve as Honorary Captain (Navy) to Maritime Forces Atlantic, as Co-Chair of the Community Leadership Advisory Council to the Admiral for Maritime Forces Atlantic, as National Council Chair of the Canadian Naval Memorial Trust, and as a Director of the Canadian Forces Liason Council. Mrs. Freeman is a national Director of Historica-Dominion Institute of Canada, the RCMP Foundation, the Duke of Edinburgh Awards, the International Women's Forum of Canada, the Canadian Friends of the Israel Museum, the Frank H. Sobey Awards for Excellence in Business Studies, the Advisory Board of the Coady International Institute, the Board of Governors of Mount Saint Vincent University and Advisor on the Legacy Committee of the 2011 Halifax Canada Games. She is married to Lawrence Freeman, QC, a partner in McInnes Cooper and is the proud mother of three children and two grandchildren.

Wanda is an award-winning Nova Scotian writer and actor. During her five years as Artistic Director of Stage East Theatre in Halifax she produced 13 shows, including nine new plays, four musicals and nine touring shows. Kill Zone a love story is Part Two of her military trilogy for theatre. BRAT, Part One, premiered at Neptune Theatre. Her other military related art includes documentary Military Wives Shut out shut up shut down which premiered at the Atlantic Film Festival and on CTV Regional and National; screenplay Wall of Silence, which won the Atlantic Film Festival's \$12,000 CBC-Linda Joy prize and long form documentaries Brats: Defying Gravity and Line of Fire: Canada's Female Soldiers for CBC Radio.

Kent Stetson



Kent Stetson, C. M., is a Governor General's Literary Award Laureate (2002) and Member of the Order of Canada (2007). He received the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal as further recognition of his services to the arts in Canada in 2013. Kent was born and raised on a farm in Prince Edward Island. As a young adult, he lived in Halifax, where he worked extensively with Wanda Graham's Stage East Theatre company as an actor, writer dramaturg and director. In his thirty year career, Kent wrote and directed film, television and theatre. He moved to Montreal in 1990 and became a full-time writer. Kent is the author of the GG award-winning play *The Harps of God*, and *The World Above the Sky*, an historical novel set in maritime Canada in 1398, one hundred years before Columbus. He has recently co-authored with his brother Paul (RCMP, ret'd) the first book in a new series of crime novels featuring P. E. I. born RCMP Major Crimes Investigator Gandhi MacKinnon. In 2013, Kent was honored to serve as McGill University's Institute for the Public Life of Arts and Ideas inaugural Artist in Residence. She is a Chalmers' Award winner for her work as an actress at the Stratford Festival, Ontario and a Stage Door Award winner for her work at Blyth Festival, Ontario. She was presented with the first Established Artist Recognition Award (Theatre) by the province of Nova Scotia. Alexis Milligan (Boyd)



Alexis Milligan is currently the Artist-in-Residence for Two Planks and a Passion Theatre. Recent credits include: Estate (LunaSea Theatre); The Nutcracker (Symphony Nova Scotia); Lysistrata (Two Planks); Seed (CityTV); Blackbird (A71 Productions); The Mighty Jungle (Gemini Award: Best Pre-School Production). In addition to her performance work, Alexis has created choreography for many theatre companies in Halifax and Toronto including One Light, Two Planks and a Passion (Rockbound – Merritt Award: 2009 Best Production), Eastern Front, LunaSea, and Native Earth. Directing credits include: A Singular Kinda Guy (Lion's Den Theatre); Into The Woods Jr. (Neptune Theatre School); A Study in Time (Nocturne Halifax); Fishing (Off The Leash Creative Ltd.). Jeff has worked as an actor and puppeteer across North America. He recently won a Robert Merritt Award (Best Supporting Actor) for his portrayal of Mr. Marks in Neptune Theatre's *Intimate Apparel*. Other recent credits include: *The Glace Bay Miners' Museum* (National Arts Centre/Neptune) *Her Big Day* (Atlantic Fringe); *Lysistrata*, *Beowulf*, *The Crucible* (*Two Planks and a Passion*); *Peter Pan*, *The Game of Love and Chance*, *Romeo and Juliet* (Neptune); *Dracula*, *The Complete Works of William Shakespeare – Abridged*, *Macbeth*, *Love's Labour's Lost* (*Shakespeare by the Sea*). 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
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Bruce MacLennan: Light Design

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
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
