With mixed weather, snow, rain and ice, it is difficult to plan ahead for a trails walk. Icy pathways can be difficult to negotiate, in particular when there are slopes! Plan to add 'icers' or 'crampons' to improve traction. And if the municipality is dumping snow or using the space at the trailhead for snow storage where you want to walk, give 311 a call. Although few trails have winter maintenance, the Mainland Linear Trail is the only one in the local region, other trails may provide a winter walking or snow-shoeing experience. But we hope that access to our local trails continues to be safe and easy for those who want to snowshoe or walk in the snow.
