Halifax North West Trails - Trail Talk for the fall

Recently we celebrated the official launch of the **Cabin Lake Trail** and the new Interpretive panel. Transit: On July 23rd, HRM Council passed a motion to locate the new Lacewood Transit Terminal adjacent to the Mainland Linear Trail on Lacewood. The trails association and transit users were not consulted on this site. Neither were the residents and taxpayers, who help pay the bills! This busy trail is dark and lonely after nightfall, so not a safe or welcoming Active Transportation route, on the Mainland Common, our HRM Major Park in the community. You may want to contact the Mayor or Council member to suggest revisiting the options at a safer, more economical commercial site and save parkland habitat. An alternate Transit Oriented Development approach has been presented to the Transit team by Dalhousie Cities and Environment Unit.

Local Councillor Reg Rankin called an Open House to look at design of a terminal, with 500 new parking spaces, for the Mainland Common but did not attend the meeting. Perhaps transit and the environment is not a priority for District 12 although he is chair of the Transportation Committee.
