

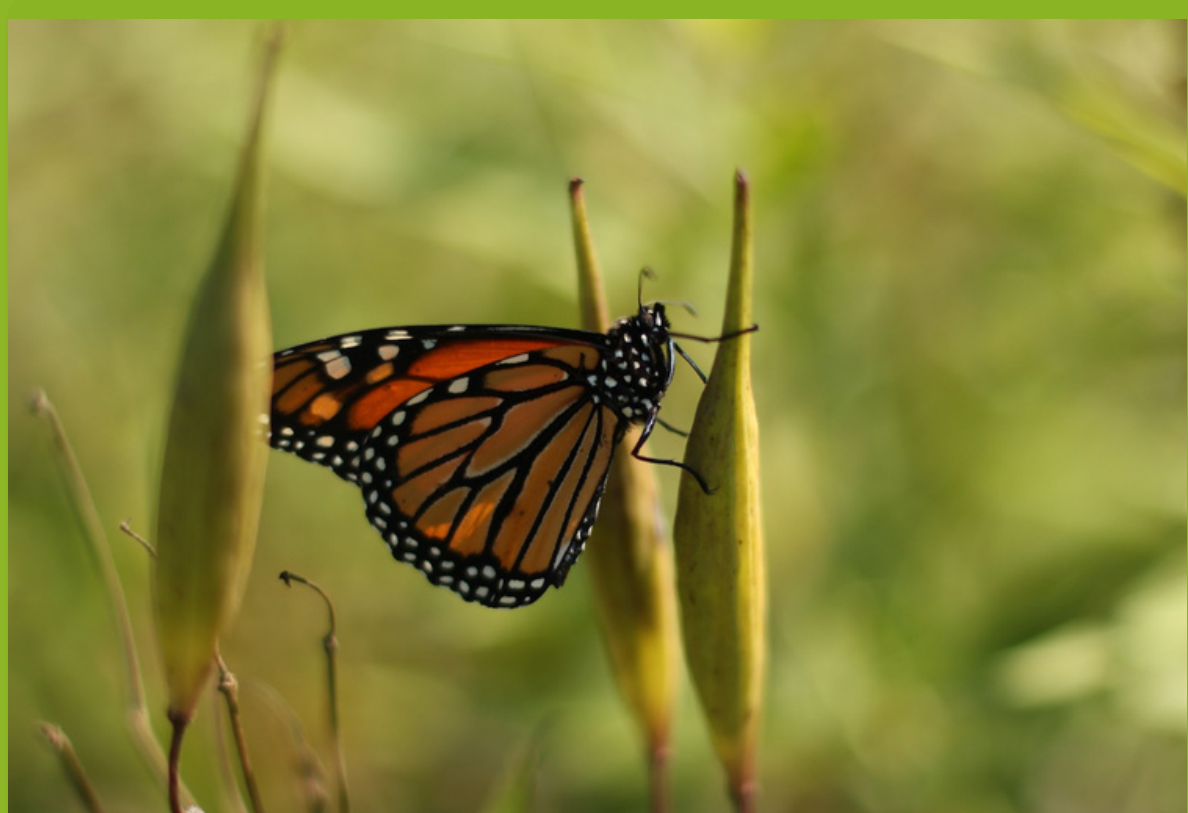
POLLINATOR PLANTS

SWAMP MILKWEED

- A standard in all pollinator gardens for its use and beauty.
- It thrives in full sun and wet soils.



- The pink flowers emerge in mid-July with a vanilla-like scent.
- A crucial food source for Monarch butterflies.
- Attracts other pollinators as well.



CANADA ANEMONE

- A sun-loving wetland plant that flowers between May and July.



- Its large and numerous flowers attract various pollinators, from butterflies to bees.
- Many varieties of moths are often attracted to white flowers.



CONEFLOWER

- Important for a wide variety of pollinators such as wasps, bees, moths and butterflies.
- Grows in an area where sun and water are plentiful.



- Blooms in August with striking yellow petal-like rays.
- They produce a prolific number of seeds in the fall that attract finches, sparrows and other birds to feed.

BLUE FLAG IRIS

- A great plant for pollinator gardens.
- It grows well in wet areas, thrives in full sun or partial shade.



SEASIDE GOLDENROD

- Goldenrod is a great option, as it provides pollen well into the fall.
- It is suited to shoreline properties, but can be used in landscaping if planted in full sun.
