The Writer's Federation of Nova Scotia is seeking a voice to read more of their their selected Nova Scotian works.

Selected artists will be asked to send a short self-tape (audio) of a section from the below title (sides will be provided)

• The Mountain and the Valley is an affectionate portrait of David Canaan, a sensitive boy who becomes increasingly aware of the difference that sets him apart from his family and his neighbours. David's desire to write is the secret that gives this haunting story its detailed focus and its poignant theme.

Set in the years leading up to World War II and against the backdrop of the Annapolis Valley's natural beauty, *The Mountain and the Valley* captures a young man's spiritual awakening and the gradual growth of artistic vision.

The Mountain and the Valley was first published in 1952 – so it will be 70 years old in 2022. It is considered a classic of Canadian literature.

The Writer's Federation are seeking an honest, sincere, open-hearted voice. David, the main character is a boy at the beginning of the book and middle-aged by the end.

Ethno-cultural mandate or ethno-cultural casting statement:

Neptune Theatre seeks to promote equity, inclusion and access by amplifying voices and stories that have been historically marginalized or underrepresented, and we factor this into every decision we make.
