



CHRISTINA MARTIN (JULY 24–26)

If raw denim had a sound, it'd be a Christina Martin chorus. In the grand tradition of highway Canadiana, Martin's songwriting is honest-to-goodness jukebox rock for the craft beer generation. The winner of multiple East Coast Music Awards, Christina Martin is currently touring her most personal and ambitious record to date "Impossible To Hold". The album won the 2018 Music Nova Scotia Award for Pop Recording of the Year, achieving a perfect balance between organic ambience and impeccable production.

Christina began recording her own music while slogging it out on the Austin, Texas bar scene. A multi award winning singer-songwriter, she has been relentlessly recording and touring in Canada and in the UK and Europe, building connections at venues big and small, singing songs about loss, love and perseverance. Her songs have been featured in films and television, and she's performed at music festivals around the world (Rolling Stone Weekender Festival, Belfast Nashville Songwriters Festival, Folk Alliance International and Reeperbahn Festival).



CHARLIE A'COURT (JULY 27-28)

Canadian singer-songwriter-guitarist Charlie A'Court is the proverbial force to be reckoned with. Planted at the crossroads of roots and soul, Charlie's mighty voice, fierce guitar work and contemporary songwriting have earned him an international following and a host of awards and accolades for his five solo albums to date, including his latest offering, "Come On Over", winner of the 2015 East Coast Music Award for Blues Recording of The Year and 2015 Music Nova Scotia Award for Blues Recording of the Year.

T. THOMASON (JULY 30—AUG 1)

With over a decade of experience in the music industry at 24 years old, T. Thomason is a force to be reckoned with in the Canadian music scene. Thomason has garnered multiple ECMA and Music Nova Scotia nominations, placements on Degrassi, songwriting awards and recognition as one of Canada's Top 25 Under 25 by CBC Music. T. has shared bills with Gord Downie, Carly Rae Jepsen, Collective Soul, The Trews. Fefe Dobson, Dragonette, and Joel Plaskett, to name a few. Thomason was named Casino Nova Scotia's Artist in Residence for 2018, and nominated for Entertainer of the Year at the 2018 Music. Nova Scotia Awards. In 2015 and early 2016, T. took personal time off to hone his musical direction and develop his EP, "sweet baby", with producer Dave Henriques (Justin Nozuka / Iskwé). The EP garnered him a nomination for Rock Recording of the Year at the 2017 Nova Scotia Music Awards. In November 2017, T. and Dave embarked on a new collaborative journey developing the pop/electronic sound of Thomason's next full length record. His two singles "Bliss" and "Loser" from his upcoming album release have earned over 190k streams. In February, 2019, T. appeared as one of five artists on an episode of CTV's hit music-reality show "The Launch", alongside mentors Scott Borchetta, Marie-Mai, and Sarah McLachlan. His song "HOPE" was launched from the episode, with his own songwriting spin on the track, and produced by Alex Hope (Troye Sivan, Tove Lo, Missy Higgins). "HOPE" reached #4 on the iTunes Pop charts and #11 overall, gaining over 100k streams in the first 2 weeks of release. "HOPE" entered Top 40 radio across Canada at #31 and takes us further into T.'s new pop sound that is bound to leave listeners wanting more.



RYAN COOK (AUG 4)

Blending the nostalgia of classic country music with modern sensibility, Ryan Cook has developed a progressive sound that fuses both the traditional and the innovative. Drawing on the enduring sounds of western-swing, country, and folk, Ryan's songbook is a deeply appreciative homage to the pioneers of hillbilly and folk. Ryan has toured heavily as a solo performer opening for country legends including Dwight Yoakam, Rosanne Cash, and Travis Tritt. His acoustic live show combines thumb-picking guitar styles, original folk ballads, and vintage Country music from the 1940's and 50's.



MUSICAL GUESTS



TOMATO/TOMATO (AUG 6-7)

Hang onto your hats because this genre-bending power duo is ready to take you on a ride! Tomato/Tomato perform an eclectic mix of folk and country that will have you rolling down your windows and singing at the top of your lungs. Their live show includes jaw dropping multitasking, dynamic guitar arrangements, and soaring vocal harmonies. Stitch these elements together with compelling, heartfelt songwriting and you have an unforgettable musical experience.



REENY SMITH (AUG 8-9)

Since releasing her first in EP in 2015, "I Am Reeny," Reeny Smith's powerful voice and vibrant, emotional rollercoaster of a stage show have solidified her as one of the most enthralling artists in Canada. Signing with Cymba Music Publishing in 2016, she released her breakout single, "Good Girl Swag", a song with an unrelenting positivity in an increasingly harsh world. Smith went on to win Music Nova Scotia's African Canadian Artist of the Year award in 2016, 2017 and 2018, as well as Best RnB Artist award in The Coast's Best of Halifax awards in 2017 and 2018. She's collaborated with artists like Quake Matthews, and opened for Anderson Paak at the Halifax Jazz Festival, but through it all, Smith says the thing she's the proudest of is developing her craft as a songwriter and being recognized for all of the hard work she's put into the depth and realism of her work. "My biggest achievement thus far has been being recognized internationally for my songwriting work. Songwriting was never something I thought I was good at, so to have reached this level of validation means a great deal to me." Top 10 finalist in National CBC Searchlight Contest.



MO KENNEY (AUG 10)

Mo Kenney delivered a powerful punch with her award winning third record, "The Details". Her latest recording, "Ahead of Myself" sees a return to the singer-songwriter genre that has made her so popular with audiences around the world. A promising young singer-songwriter, she has grown into a dynamic artist with a catalogue of attitude-driven music that, whether acoustic or indie rock, will pull at your heartstrings. Mo Kenney captivates all who hear her.





MAKAYLA LYNN (AUG 11)

Named by Rolling Stone Magazine as a new artist you need to know, Halifax born Makayla Lynn is a fresh new face in Nashville working hard to make a name for herself on both sides of the border. Winner of the East Coast Music Award for Country Album of the Year and Fan's Choice Video of the Year, after spending a little time at #1 on CMT's 12 pack countdown, Makayla's sound is often described as neither traditional nor mainstream, but instead a sweet spot right in the middle



HEATHER RANKIN (AUG 13–18)

Heather Rankin is a Canadian singer, songwriter, and actor. She is best known as a member of the platinum, multi-selling, iconic musical group the Rankin Family. Between 1989 and 1999, the family band released five full albums, and toured Canada, the U.S., the UK, Australia, and New Zealand. They won six Juno Awards, three Canadian Country Music Awards, an American Country Music TV award and 15 East Coast Music awards. Combined sales of their recordings exceeded 1.5 million copies. Heather was the lead singer on many of their biggest hit records.



LENNIE GALLANT (AUG 20-25)

Recognized by his peers as one of Canada's best performing songwriters, Lennie Gallant has released twelve albums (10 in English and 2 in French) of original songs which have won him a host of awards and nominations from the JUNOs. Les Prix Eloizes, and The East Coast Music Awards, including 2017 ECMA Entertainer of the Year. His double CD of the 22 songs from his multimedia hit production. "Searching For Abeqweit." which ran for 140 shows, also won him an ECMA. He was named Canadian Folk Artist of The Year for 2016 and his song "Peter's Dream" was voted one of the Top Ten East Coast Songs of All Time. A recipient of the Order of Canada, Lennie is an internationally touring artist, who has performed all over the continent, in Europe, for the troops in Afghanistan, and at the XXI Winter Olympics. He has toured with Symphony Nova Scotia, Symphony New Brunswick, and with Symphony PEI. His songs have been covered by numerous artists including Jimmy Buffett, The Rankins, and Measha Brueggergosman and has appeared in feature films and TV shows. One of his albums, "When We Get There," even went up to the international space station with Canadian Astronaut Julie Payette (now the Governor General of Canada) for the crew to enjoy and orbited the planet 248 times. How about that for high rotation!




