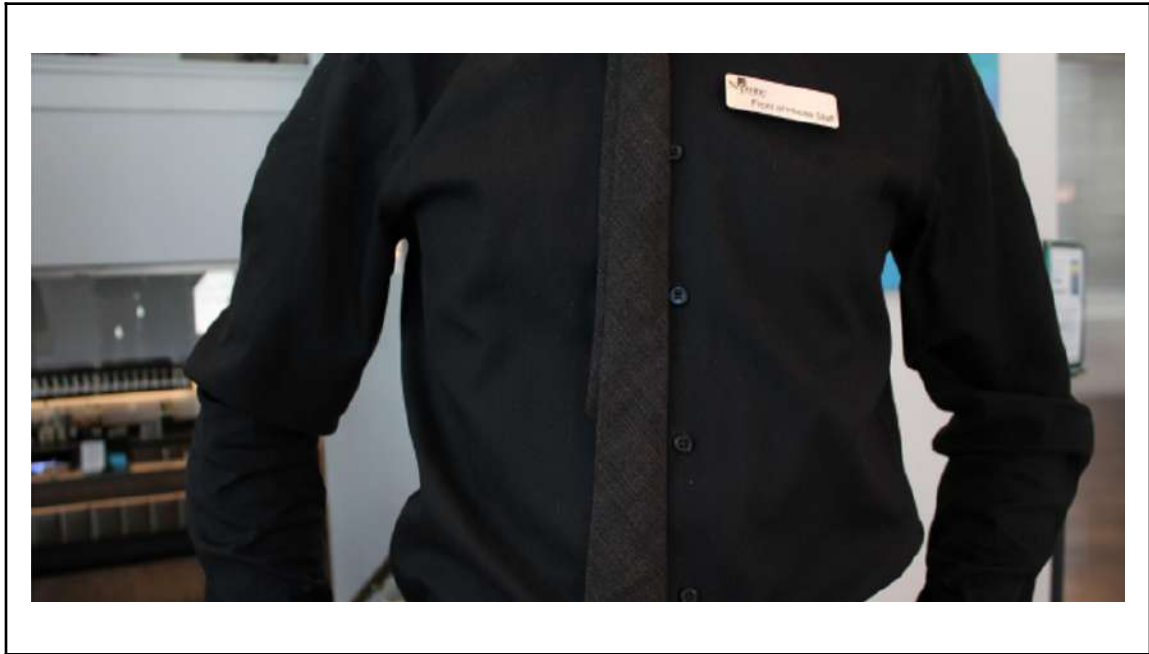




The SpongeBob Musical Neptune Theatre

Information Guide



The Neptune Theatre staff will be wearing black shirts with a silver tag.

Please communicate with any of the staff if you have a question or need assistance.



At the start of the show, you'll hear bells ringing. This can be loud as it is being used to get the audience's attention. This bell sound does not last long, and means you should head into the theatre to take your seat.



This performance is not exactly like the TV show.

There will be singing, dancing, and there will be characters from the TV show, but they will look like real people - not cartoons.



This show is a musical, and can be quite loud. If you do not like loud music or singing, you should bring headphones.



There will be a fog machine pumping fog onto the stage. This may roll into the audience. It is completely safe, and will go away after a few minutes.



Throughout the show, several actors go through the audience aisles to make their entrance onstage.



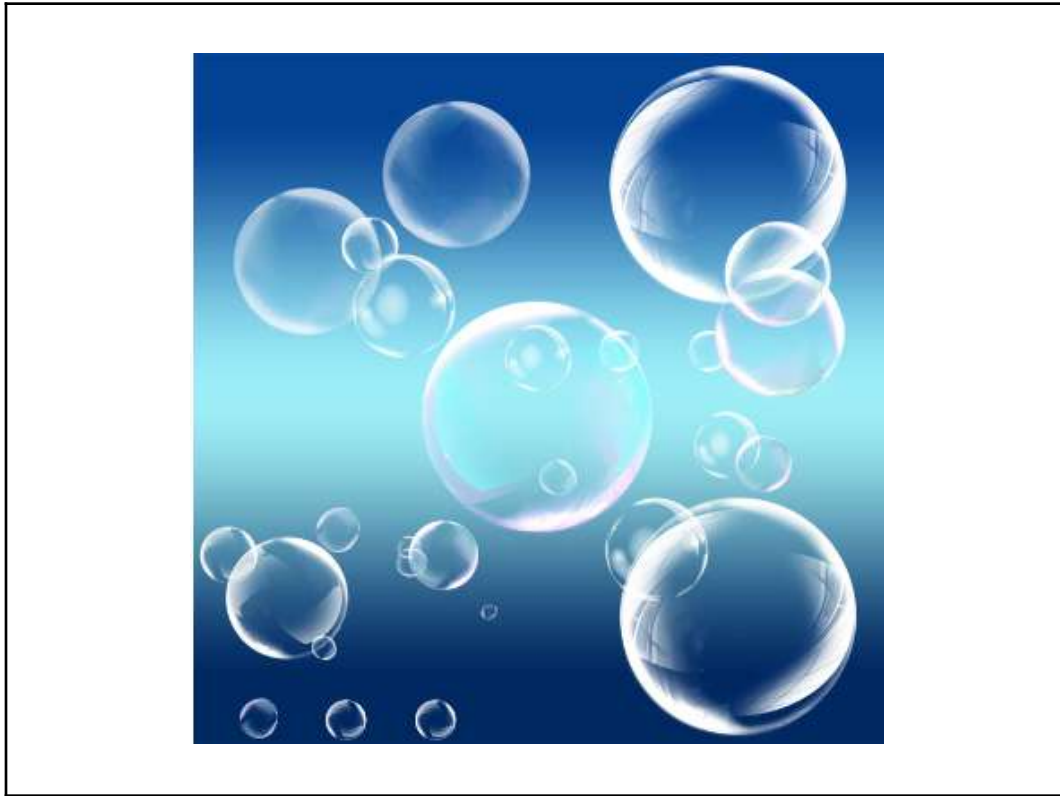
In the first half of the show, there is a musical number that has actors wearing all black and tiny finger lights. These lights are small but bright, and may be pointed at the audience throughout the song.



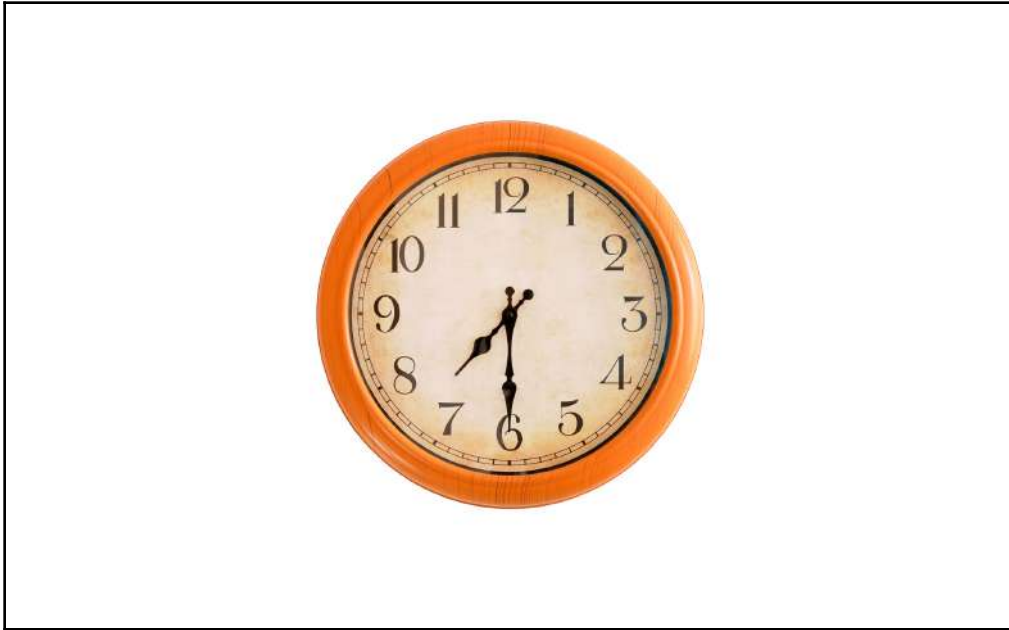
Throughout the show, some characters get hit by fake boulders, or get into fights with other characters. It looks like they are really fighting or really getting hit, but this is all pretend and no one actually gets hurt.



There are several explosions, rumbles, zaps, dings, and bangs throughout the show. These are all meant to happen, and may be startling.



Near the end of the show, really bubbles fall from the sky. They may go into the first few rows of the audience. These are completely safe to touch, and the effect lasts for less than a minute.



The show has two acts with a 15 minute intermission between the acts. Each act is approximately one hour long. This show starts at 2:00pm and ends around 4:30pm.

If you need to leave the theatre before intermission, or before the show is over, you are welcome to. We ask that you do so as quietly as possible. A member of staff will help you find your seat again when you are ready to re-enter the theatre.



Sometimes audience members like to clap their hands after a song in the show is done, and at the end of the performance.

We ask that all audience members NOT clap their hands. Instead, you can snap your fingers, or wave your hands in the air.
