

Field finishing of Polyurea Primer

Polyurea Primer is a two component coating consisting of a pigmented component and a clear reactive curing agent. It is a tough, reactive coating which actually penetrates into the wood fibers for outstanding adhesion and flexibility.

When field finishing Polyurea Primer the following steps should be taken for optimum adhesion of the finish coat.

- Scuff sand all coated surfaces to complete dullness with 220 grit sandpaper or #1 steel wool.
- Wipe clean with a cloth dampened with a good quality lacquer thinner, following label instructions. This step is most important to insure final topcoat adhesion.
- Finish with two coats of quality exterior grade paint. Care should be taken to ensure that the weather stripping and hardware stays free from paint.

Recommended topcoats are PITTSBURGH® PAINTS MANOR HALL® 74, 75 or 79-line or MANOR HALL® TIMELESSTM 73-line. Follow label instructions. Apply "as is" from the can, do not reduce.
