

## **NS Talent Trust Application Checklist 2024**

Dear Applicant,

Before you begin the online application process, make sure you have all support materials ready: PDF files, video/sound link, and other support materials. If you need support with your application, we are here to help! Your application must be submitted **before 5:00 p.m. Atlantic Standard Time (AST) on March 1** (Spring/Summer studies) or **5:00 p.m. Atlantic Daylight Time (ADT) on May 1** (Fall/Winter studies) and contain the following:

- Completed online application form.
- If applicable, a copy of your Permanent Residency status (PDF format).
- Verification of acceptance into your program of study, if available (PDF format).
- Copy (PDF format) or online link to the course outline or program description, as provided by the school, university, or institution.
- Current artist résumé no longer than 2 pages (PDF format).
- Artist statement (max. 500 words), in written or video format.
- Budget, as outlined in the online application form.
- Index of your support material (PDF format).

Support material for your discipline:

• Dance/Theatre/Opera/Music/Circus Arts/Film: Merge your video/sound recordings into 1 video and upload to YouTube, Vimeo and/or SoundCloud and copy and paste

the link to your online application. If applicant is applying for both deadlines (March 1<sup>st</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup>) then a new introduction and one new piece of content must be added to the applicant's video for the May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. Once you have applied, do <u>not</u> reupload your revised video. A new file upload will overwrite your original link, which means the jury will be unable to view your work.

- Visual Arts/Fine Craft/Theatre Design: Upload a portfolio (1 pdf file) with 10 images (1 image/page) of your work with a complete description of each piece. (The file cannot be more than 8 MB.)
  - o for artwork that is not easily represented in a flat PDF, you may submit video. Please merge all videos together.
- **Literary Arts/Composition**: Upload your PDF writing/score samples in one merged document (not more than 20 pages).

If you're proposing private study, **you must obtain the following from your teacher** and include it in your online application (PDF format):

- A formal course outline, including proposed repertoire/curricular goals (PDF format).
- The number of lessons, as well as the duration and cost of each lesson (PDF format).
- A statement of interest from your teacher that describes why they believe this course of study would be beneficial (PDF format).
- The anticipated curricular outcome of your successful completion of the study program (PDF format).
- A current résumé from your teacher (PDF format).

If you will be furthering your arts education through a mentorship with an established artist, **you must provide the following** and include it in your application (PDF format):

- The name of your mentor
- A detailed description of the project plan
- A letter of support from your mentor
- A balanced budget and proposal indicating how you will use the awarded funds (mentor honorarium, living expenses, equipment/supplies, etc).

Note: Please give your teacher or mentor enough time to gather this information for you.

If you wish to apply for both Fall/Winter and Spring/Summer study periods, please be aware that you must make separate applications. You can only apply to the Fall/Winter deadline after the Spring/Summer application deadline has closed on March 1. For applicants applying to the May 1 deadline, the online application system will be shut down for maintenance for 2 weeks following the March 1 deadline. You will be able to submit your application when the application portal reopens.
