### *Who may apply?*

- Applicants who demonstrate the commitment to pursue a career in directing and who are not yet established in their field.

### *Written support material:*

- [Artist statement](#) (max. 500 words).
  - Artist Statements can be submitted in written or video format, whichever you feel represents you best. (If choosing the video option, please merge with any other supporting videos).
- Budget, as directed in the online application.
- [Artist résumé](#), with special focus on your directing credits (PDF format).
- An analysis of how you would direct a particular play. Choose 1 from the theatre canon that has been previously produced and is not too obscure (PDF format, **1000 words maximum**).
- Letter of intent (this could be a separate PDF or included as part of your artist statement in the online application form) detailing:
  - the reason for this particular program of study
  - what you hope to accomplish
  - your strengths/weaknesses as a director
  - future plans (if known)

- Optional: 1 reference letter from someone who has insight into your specific abilities as a director (PDF format).
- Attached files should be no more than 32 MB. If you have difficulty uploading your file, create separate files, no larger than 8 MB each.

*By following these guidelines, you will ensure you provide submissions that clearly demonstrate ability and potential, and relate directly to the program proposed in the application.
