

The Nova Scotia Talent Trust (NSTT) believes that artistically gifted Nova Scotians should be able to secure adequate funding to develop their talents. That's why the NSTT strives to provide scholarships to individuals who demonstrate exceptional potential and commitment to become established artists in their chosen fields. The NSTT is a not-for-profit registered charity with an independent Board of Directors.

The Nova Scotia Talent Trust helps to ensure the future of Nova Scotia's vibrant cultural life by supporting tomorrow's artists today. Applicants of any age may apply to the NSTT but support is reserved for those who are not yet established in their fields. The NSTT supports Nova Scotians who are undertaking programs of study which will advance their artistic development and those who are pursuing career paths that will lead them to become established artists.

Why We Do What We Do

The Nova Scotia Talent Trust believes that the arts are essential for a well-rounded and healthy society. That's why, for over seventy years, the NSTT has championed talented Nova Scotians. It all began in 1944, with the support of a single vocal artist, the renowned singer Portia White. Today, the NSTT supports artists in all disciplines.

As tuition fees in arts disciplines become increasingly prohibitive and as financial return is often the principle incentive for making career decisions, the NSTT's financial backing is becoming critical for Nova Scotian artists.

Choosing a career in the arts requires the kind of passion and commitment that demands recognition and support. The NSTT is one of only a handful of organizations that offers scholarships/awards to artists at the formative stage of their careers. It is unique in the province with the level of support it gives to emerging talent in all art forms.

In order to achieve a meaningful level of support for scholarship recipients, the Nova Scotia Talent Trust is committed to raising funds to realize this goal.

Why Your Support Is So Important

Your financial contribution will enable the NSTT to continue and increase funding to help tomorrow's important artists when they need it most – today. More importantly, your support will validate Nova Scotia's emerging artists and their work.

In 1961 the average NSTT scholarship was \$600 (8 scholarships) Fifty years later, in 2011, the average NSTT scholarship was \$1,309 (55 scholarships). This is an increase of only \$709 in 50 years.

Five 'Quick Facts' about the NSTT

- 1) The Nova Scotia Talent Trust is an independent organization governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. Recognized professional artists in their field form an independent volunteer Scholarship Selection Committee of approx. twelve members to award scholarships and special awards.
- 2) The Nova Scotia Talent Trust has awarded a total of more than \$2 million in scholarships since 1944.
- 3) Recipients have used the funds to enrich their artistic experience, studying at institutions such as: the National Ballet School of Canada, the Banff Centre for the Arts, the National Theatre School of Canada, the Julliard School, the Art Institute of Chicago, the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts, the New England Conservatory of Music and the Canadian Film Centre.
- 4) NSTT recipients over the last 70 years include harpsichordist **Gordon Murray**, organist **John Grew**, soprano **Deborah Jeans**, actor **Don Allison**, painter **Jean Edmonds Hancock**, classical guitarist **Dale Kavanagh**, French horn player **David Parker**, soprano **Sue Doran**, filmmaker **Shandi Mitchell** and actress **Sara Orenstein**. More recently, artists have included dancer **Sarah Murphy**, composer **Cy Giacomin**, actor **Anne Marie Woods**, poet **Maureen Hull**, soprano **Jane Archibald**, luthier **Simon Shaw**, dancer **Ian Parsons** and cellist **Denise Djokic**.
- 5) In the past year the Nova Scotia Talent Trust has presented a total of \$104,750 in scholarships and special awards to 49 recipients.

This, along with the inevitable consequence of ever-increasing demands made on governments for funding, led us to see the importance of having an endowment fund to provide ongoing, stable funding for the Nova Scotia Talent Trust. The role of the NSTT **Foundation** is to steward significant resources and make the income available to the NSTT to fund artists in accordance with its mandate.

Now, in addition to supporting our developing artists on an annual basis through the Nova Scotia Talent Trust, you can also make a donation to the endowment fund through the NSTT **Foundation**. Contributions are eligible for a charitable donation receipt. They may be made as a one-time gift or pledged over time. Nova Scotia Talent Trust Former Scholarship Recipients

Walter Borden – Actor, Poet – In addition to film, television and radio work, he has recorded the critically acclaimed CD *Walter Borden Reads the Sonnets of William Shakespeare to the Music of Fernando Sor.* He is a recipient of the Order of Canada and the African Nova Scotian Music Association (ANSMA) Music Heritage Award for his mentoring and promoting two generations of African Nova Scotian musical talent, as well as the Portia White Prize.

Barbara Hannigan – Soprano, Conductor – *She is an artist who combines thrilling passion with exceptional technique. Much sought after in contemporary music - she has given over 75 world premières - she is no less brilliant and devoted a performer of Baroque and Classical music. Bringing freshness to older music and authority to new, she is among the very few singers whose every performance is an occasion. – Paul Griffiths*

Janice Jackson – Soprano – Janice Jackson is one of Canada's foremost interpreters of contemporary vocal repertoire. She has performed in modern music festivals and concert halls around the world, sung over 180 world premieres, appeared as a guest artist with numerous modern music ensembles. A highlight during 2011 was the world premiere of Tim Brady's *We're Hardcore*, seven songs based on poetry by the Tragically Hip's Gordon Downie with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra.

Veronique MacKenzie – Dancer, Choreographer – MacKenzie has been one of Nova Scotia's most eclectic choreographers for more than 20 years having created for film, television and the stage. She has performed across the country creating multi-disciplinary and site-specific productions. A recipient of one of Nova Scotia's prestigious Established Artist Awards she continues to create collaborative work as well as immerse herself in the exploration of the comedic and traditional genres.

Alasdair MacLean – Composer – MacLean's compositions have been played across Canada and in the US, Britain, France, China and Japan. He was appointed the first ever composer-in-residence with Symphony Nova Scotia 1996-2000. MacLean's tenure provided six new works for orchestra or chorus and orchestra, and a piano concerto commissioned by the CBC. His piece *One Becoming* was featured in Redstar Film's portrait of Denise Djokic, *Seven Days, Seven Nights*.

Shandi Mitchell – Author, Filmmaker – Mitchell graduated from Dalhousie University with a degree in English and Theatre. Her award-winning short films have been featured at festivals across North America. In 2008, she was awarded the Canada Council's Victor Martin-Lynch Staunton Endowment in Media Arts. Her debut novel *Under This Unbroken Sky* has sold in nine countries. Her debut feature film *The Disappeared* was shown in all major Film Festivals across Canada. Shawn Doyle won Best Actor Award 2013 for his role in *The Disappeared*.

Ian Parsons – Dancer – Parsons began his dance training at the Maritime Conservatory of the Performing Arts and went on to attend Canada's National Ballet School, graduating in 2007. He stayed at the National Ballet of Canada as an apprentice. In 2009, he joined Les Ballets de Monte Carlo in Monaco. In June 2012, he relocated to London to pursue a musical theatre career; dancing in *Les Miserables* (Film) and *Cabaret*.

E. Alex Pierce – Author – Her poetry collection, *Vox Humana*, was published by Brick in 2011. She holds an MFA in Creative Writing (poetry) from Warren Wilson College, NC, and is currently Series Editor for the CBU Press' *The Essential Cape Breton Library*. Pierce has won numerous awards for both poetry and creative non-fiction, and conducts writing workshops across Canada. *Whatever the subject, the real strength of Pierce's work lies in the richness of its landscape which is forever opening out before us, transfigured by an inner music and wonder and light – John Glenday.*

Colleen Wolstenholme – Jewellery, Painting, Sculpture, Embroidery, Digital Collage – She received a Bachelor of Fine Art in 1986 from NSCAD and a Master of Fine Art in 1992 from the State University of New York, The College at New Paltz. Her pharmaceutically inspired sculptures and jewellery gained prominence internationally and her work has been widely featured in magazines and journals, as well as being reviewed in numerous art publications.


