Liette Doucet elected NSTU President

Teachers, Nova Scotia Community College faculty and professional support staff have elected Liette Doucet to the position of president of the Nova Scotia Teachers Union.

Doucet is a teacher with the Halifax Regional School Board and has been serving as the president of the Halifax City Local of the NSTU. Doucet has been a senior elementary teacher for 26 years, most recently teaching at Fairview Heights Elementary School in Halifax. She defeated Wally Fiander, NSTU's current First Vice-President in a second ballot election held today, Thursday, June 2.

The first round of voting by the 10,000 members of the NSTU was conducted electronically Wednesday, May 25, but did not produce a winner. To become president of the NSTU, a candidate must win with a majority of votes (50 per cent + 1).

Sixty-five per cent of NSTU's membership participated in the electronic run-off vote held today.

Doucet will assume office August 1, 2016, replacing Shelley Morse who served for four years, completing two, two-year terms currently allowed under NSTU election guidelines.
