

NSTU Provincial Executive Meeting Thursday, October 14, 2004 H i g h l i g h t s

- 1. Received the Nominating Committee report, appointing the Substitute Teacher Committee; Provincial Economic Welfare Committee; Community College Negotiating Committee; and representatives to the Pension Investment Advisory Committee, Professional Development Committee; College Union Committee, and the Single Tier Bargaining Committee.
- 2. Received the Personnel Committee Report; approving the hiring of *Ron Brunton* as Executive Staff Office to fill the position in Professional Initiatives; approved the advertisement of a Term Executive Staff Position for Professional Development Initiatives;
- 3. Approved the Asking Packages for the Faculty and Professional Support Collective Agreements, as presented.
- 4. Approved motions from the Table Officers' Report, including
 - a resolution for Council 2005 addressing the ineligibility of an Provincial Executive Member to serve more than one elected office at a time (Locally or Regionally);
 - the location of the Executive Planning Conference, June 28-30, 2005 at the Inverary Inn, Baddeck;
 - two special Executive Meeting dates were added: November 12th and December 17th.
- 5. Approved, in principle, an offer from the Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia, to institute an annual award;
- 6. Postponed a report from the NSTU Organizational Audit Committee until after Council 2005;
- 7. Approved a resolution for Council 2005 addressing a policy statement on the staffing of small high schools;
- 8. Approved the proposal by the Public Affairs Committee of the administration of a hospitality suite for the two political conventions for the 2004-2005 school year;
- 9. Approved recommendations from the Women in Education Committee (a voice for diversity, equity and social justice) regarding the distribution of the Information Kits from the Lesbian, Gay and Bisexual Youth Project to the RCH Coordinators at the regional school boards; and to the Local Presidents and RRC Chairs at the Conference on October 15-16, 2004.
- 10. Directed the NSTU President to write a letter to the Minister of Education with a copy to school boards, expressing concern regarding professional development initiatives being offered by school boards during the provincial conference day in October.
