



SAFETY & SECURITY POLICIES

We strive to provide a safe and pleasant environment for our customers and to do so the management of South Shore Centre asks that you comply with the rules of conduct that are listed below. Violation of the South Shore Centre rules of conduct will result in the issuance of a Protection of Property Notice to the properties under the management of the Landlord which includes South Shore Centre and/or any applicable Provincial fines. The following are prohibited on South Shore Centre property:

1. Smoking within South Shore Centre, in accordance with the Smoke Free Places Act, or in non-designated areas.
2. Loitering on the property.
3. Any and all behaviour that may interfere with the safe and pleasant environment for our customers and tenants. This includes running, horseplay, fighting, using profanities, intoxication etc.
4. Wearing disguises including masks, hoods, face warmers, etc. within South Shore Centre.
5. Any distribution of flyers or other literature, or solicitation of products or services without consent from South Shore Centre management.
6. Any gathering in large groups which would interfere with traffic.
7. The use of South Shore Centre property including tables, benches, garbage receptacles, etc. for anything other than their intended purpose.
8. Possession of any weapons, whether real or toy, at any time. Any purchase of these products must be kept in its original package with a sales receipt while on the property.
9. Any photography or video recording on the property without consent of South Shore Centre management.
10. Any infraction to public health and safety regulations including no pets, with the exception of special aid pets, within the common areas. Animals are not permitted to be tied and/or left unattended on the property. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times within South Shore Centre.
11. Bicycles, scooters, etc. inside South Shore Centre.
