### **Blue Light Memorial**

Remember your loved ones this Christmas.
For every \$5 donation, a blue light on the tree will be changed to white. On your envelope, please include the name your bulb is in memory of as this will be recorded on a poster by the tree. The lights change from blue to white to represent the move from Advent (blue) into Christmas (white)

### **Turkey Tree**

Every donation helps. When a total of \$20 has been donated, a turkey ornament will be placed on the Turkey Tree in the narthex. All donations go towards the purchase of turkeys for Beacon House's Christmas Hampers.

### **Mission To Seafarer Christmas Shoeboxes**

Mission To Seafarer Christmas Shoeboxes is a Parish project lead by Mothers' Union. Requested Items (Size small or medium): Hat, work gloves, mitts, socks, scarf, soap, body wash (no larger than 375 ml), toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, shaving foam, razors, deodorant, lip balm, pen/pencil, small packages of tissues, comb, mementos of NS, PEI or Canada, wrapped hard candy (no chocolate).

We have a donation of playing cards for each box and Mothers' Union provide a Christmas card and pack up the boxes at their November meeting.

They are also in need of size S winter coats for men. All items can be put in the bin in the narthex between Nov 2-Nov. 21. Monetary donations can also be placed on the plate, cheques to St. Francis, label clearly with your envelope/PAD number and direct funds to Mission to Seafarers. We will take in one cheque from any monetary donations. This saves you the shopping and the Mission purchase items for the shoeboxes that they need to fill them.

Clea is currently using resources recommended by the Diocese for class materials.

### **Outreach Update**

On behalf of the Outreach Committee, we sincerely thank the St. Francis family for your ongoing generosity in supporting our outreach initiatives. Your contributions make a real difference in the lives of those in need within our community.

We continue to aid the community fridge/cupboard at Opportunity Place by supplying Walmart gift cards, funded through both our Outreach budget and \$900 in individual donations. Family hygiene kits are being distributed, and we support youth at the Den at the Sackville Library with snacks and other requested items.

St. Francis continues to support Beacon House Shelter and Food Bank through weekly food donations, clothing, small household items, and desserts. Members also serve meals onsite at the shelter, and our partnership with Cobbs Bakery enables us to provide fresh bread and baked goods regularly. This year, we donated \$815 in school supplies and contributed 246 cans of cranberry sauce for the Christmas Hamper drive, along with generous Thanksgiving donations. Additionally, we have applied for an Anglican Foundation grant to supply the shelter with laptop computers.

On August 30th a group from St. Francis went onsite to St. George's Soup Kitchen to supply about 140 meals of hamburgers, hot dogs, potato salad, roll and dessert to the guests they serve on a weekly basis. After the meal we were able to donate extra food to the Gordon B Isner senior apartments in Halifax and some potato salad to Beacon House Shelter

The Community Events group, now led by Lisa Herritt, organized a very successful Halloween Community Party on Saturday, October 25. A howling great time of games, events, food and candy with almost 100 ghost, goblins and other characters in attendance.

Stay tuned for our plans to support Alongside Hope formerly PWRDF.

We are currently working on our list of 2026 Outreach projects and budget. We look forward to your continued generous support of our Outreach activities.
