

## Vaccines

- For discretionary events and activities, proof of full vaccination is required for **all attendees** for the event who are 12 or older. Proof of full vaccination is required for **all volunteers**.
- Children who turned 12 between January 1 and October 4 this year will have until December 31 to attend events and activities while they get vaccinated; children who turn 12 after October 4 will have three months from their birthday. **Youth** who are 13 to 18 years old and have proof that they received one dose of vaccine can participate in sport, recreation, arts and culture programming and have until October 26 to get their second dose.
- People with a valid medical reason that prevents vaccination can get an exception letter from their physician or nurse practitioner to show instead of proof of full vaccination.

## Masks

- Masks continue to be mandatory in indoor public places.
- performer or officiant who is performing activities that require vocalization (like talking or singing) at a faith gathering, wedding, funeral, social event, or arts and culture event is excepted from wearing a mask

## Social Distancing

- Social distancing is encouraged but no longer required at events hosted by organizations or businesses (including rehearsals, workshops, performances, classes, etc.)
- **Contact tracing** is no longer required
- Gathering limit for events hosted by a business or organization are lifted

Organizations are encouraged to develop their own inhouse vaccination policy for staff
