

- **Rehearsals and Performances**

- (Cast and Crew)

- Organized arts and culture rehearsals and performances can have up to a maximum of **25 persons indoors and 50 persons outdoors** without physical distancing, or in multiple groups of 25 persons indoors or 50 persons outdoors with **physical distancing between groups**.
- Need to create workflow and site-specific plans to reduce the risk of exposure. Refer to CCH COVID-19 Stakeholder Guidance Document
- A 6 foot distance is required between performers on stage and the audience. In the case of musical performances, the distance must be 12 feet.
- Limited socialization is permitted between cast/crew and audience after the performance, however all distancing and masking protocols must be followed.

Suggestions:

Posting signage and staff to encourage and monitor physical distancing. Having one way exit and entry traffic and others as suggested by the guidelines



- **Spectators/ Audiences**

Organizers must have a COVID-19 Prevention Plan (Government of Nova Scotia reviews plans for large venues) All persons are required to wear a mask in doors unless exempted

Spectators are permitted with a limit of **50% of indoor capacity of the facility up to a maximum of 150 spectators or up to 250 spectators outdoors**

All audience members are required to wear masks throughout the performance (unless actively eating or drinking) and individual social groups must be separated by a minimum of 6 feet.

Plans for hosting **multiple groups**, each group meeting the gathering limits, are permitted if following the guidance outlined by CCH COVID-19 Stakeholder Guidance Document:
