At VETS Canada, our Ground Support program is designed to address the most immediate needs of veterans who are homeless or at risk, providing practical and compassionate assistance. We are a federally registered non-profit charity with a national network of dedicated volunteers—many of whom are veterans themselves. In addition to immediate support, our mission includes promoting long-term dignity, stability, and healing for those who have served.

We established the Food Pantry at our national headquarters—The Garrison—to meet a growing need. The Veterans Food Pantry was created in response to the growing number of veterans reaching out to us because they are unable to afford basic groceries for themselves or their families. Many of the veterans we assist are facing financial hardship due to fixed incomes, unexpected emergencies, housing instability, or difficulty transitioning back into civilian life. For some, accessing food through our pantry is the difference between going hungry and having a stable meal on the table.

The pantry is stocked with a wide range of non-perishable foods such as canned proteins, soups, pasta, rice, vegetables, cereals, and pantry staples. We also stock perishable items, such as produce, meat, cheese and eggs. Additionally, we supply hygiene items, basic household necessities. and - when funding permits - grocery gift cards. These gift cards are especially important as they allow veterans to supplement their pantry items, ensuring they can maintain dignity and choice in their food preparation.

Veterans can access the Food Pantry through our Ground Support program, either by visiting The Garrison directly or by working with one of our trained volunteers across the country. Many veterans we serve struggle with mobility, transportation, or mental health challenges, so our team often prepares and delivers customized food packages based on the individual's needs and circumstances.

During the holiday season, demand grows significantly. Many veterans feel increased financial pressure, and families in crisis often fear they won't be able to provide a holiday meal for their loved ones. Our Holiday Dinner initiative is designed to address this need specifically, and the Food Pantry plays a central role in ensuring that every veteran who reaches out can receive support with dignity, warmth, and respect.
