

Advent/Christmas 2021 - A Red Letter Day For Us All

I have a calendar on my wall at home that is filled with "red letter days." You probably know what I mean, certain days of the year are highlighted by red print identifying some special happening, holiday or event. This practice of indicating red letter days is something that dates back into Roman antiquity. Red letter days were days of cultural and social significance that helped Romans define who they were.

We all have our own personal "red letter" days. Days that define who we are and maybe how others see us. We celebrate birthdays and special anniversaries. There are graduation days and holidays. Maybe this past year it was your vaccination day. Or the day you got to see loved ones you haven't seen in a while. Or the day you were diagnosed or recovered from an illness. We need them because in spite of how the world defines itself and how we may see our lives, our faith and our God offers us a change of perspective.

Christmas is a red-letter day we can spend a lot of time and energy attempting to define for ourselves. We may define it by selecting the right gifts, choosing the right décor, by carefully planning the menu, or spending it with certain people. The list can get long when we think of everything we "must do" and "ought to do" to make Christmas our red letter day -to make Christmas "Christmas."

As we prepare for Advent and anticipate the celebration of Christmas, besides the things we think we "must do" and "ought to do," there is one thing we can do. We can receive Christmas as the gift it is. The day we celebrate a God who comes as a vulnerable child, born in the night, away from the centres of power, in what were very uncertain times. We remember the birth of Jesus -an event that changes our definition of God and the value of every person. A day that remembers the gift of a baby in a manger and the love and peace and future promise he brings. This is God's red letter day *for* us and for so many in this world.
